

Master's degree in English Language Instruction



60-credit two-semester full time MA in ELT programme at the Department of English Language Pedagogy, School of English and American Studies (SEAS), Eötvös Loránd University Budapest.

Instruction of English as a Foreign Language MA

ELIGIBILITY

BA degree + C1 level (e.g. IELTS 7.0) certified English language competence. The admission procedure includes an interview, either face to face or via skype, depending on the applicant's availability.

TUITION FEE

For non-Hungarian nationals: 3,500 €/semester.

TIME FRAME

The academic year starts in September and finishes in July. It is divided into two semesters, each followed by an exam period. The programme requires a 20-hour/week full time commitment throughout the two semesters.

VENUE

The Faculty of Arts of Eötvös Loránd University is situated in Budapest, the capital of Hungary. The campus is in the city centre and easily accessible by public transport.

STAFF

All courses are taught by distinguished ELT professionals – both native and non-native speakers of English – who have extensive international teacher training experience, including courses taught in Britain, Turkey, Ethiopia, Germany, Russia, China, etc.

THESIS

In order to complete the MA, participants are required to submit a 40-page thesis. This will be based on focused classroom research or on some other professionally relevant project.

TEACHING PRACTICE

One of the professionally most attractive components of the programme is the 50-hour teaching practice in the spring term, when the participants have the opportunity to practise their newly learnt skills with groups of real learners under the guidance of trained and experienced mentors.


CAREER OPPORTUNITIES
