



COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Ukrainian Department

UKR11-211 Ukrainian Linguistics 1 (Phonetics, Phonology, Morphology)

Introducing to the basic concepts of descriptive linguistics. Introducing to the basic concepts of descriptive linguistics. Studying of the laws and patterns of the phonetic system, the grammatical system of the Ukrainian language. Basic knowledge of systemic linguistics knowledge of the most important areas of applied linguistics. The most important basics and issues of contrastive linguistics needed for teaching.

UKR11-212 Ukrainian Linguistics 1 (Phonetics, Phonology, Morphology)

Pronunciation exercises. Practice in phonetic laws and regularities of the Ukrainian language. Grammar exercises, practical application of the knowledge learned at lectures. Coaching students and harmonizing their different levels of proficiency by exercises.

UKR11-205 Ukrainian Language Practice 3

The acquisition of language in sequential system at upper intermediate level. Development of oral and writing skills, comprehension tasks: comprehension test, listening comprehension. Coaching of the practice language, harmonizing of different levels of proficiency by exercises.

UKRD-201 Ukrainian Language Practice 1

The aim of language practice is to acquire the Ukrainian language in sequential system at advanced level with special regard to the acquisition of both oral and written translation skills. Furthermore, we consider the possession of skills in understanding and preparing essays, academic lectures and publications as well as vocabulary building and improving the knowledge of grammar and syntax to be very important.

UKRD16-211 System of the Current Ukrainian Language 1 (Lexicology, Phraseology)

Learning the lexical system of the modern Ukrainian language. Basic concepts of lexicology. The lexicon of the Ukrainian language in terms of origin. Active and passive vocabulary. Vocabulary in terms of use. Social dialects. Classification of phraseologies. The idioms in current use.

UKRD-105 Modern Ukrainian Language, Culture, Identity 1

The main branches of the culture accumulated on the Ukrainian-speaking cultural area, and those intellectual and artistic trends which have influenced the development of the characteristic profile of the Ukrainian culture, and which are part of the universal human culture. Introduction to the

contemporary literature, fine arts, cinematography and music. The role of teaching Ukrainian language and literature in the development of personality.

BBN-UKR11-231 // BBN-UKR16-231 Ukrainian Civilization 1

Getting to know the historical contacts and processes, and the linguistic, literary and other cultural interferences which have defined the cultural profile of the Hungarian and the Ukrainian nation. The seminar aims to provide an overview on several fields of Ukrainian history, civilisation and culture. Historical and cultural relations between Ukraine and Hungary from the Middle Ages to the present day.

BBN-UKR11-221 // BBN-UKR11-225 History of Ukrainian Literature 1 (from the beginnings until the end of the 19th century)

History of the Ukrainian literature from the beginnings to the end of the 19th century. General characteristics of literary epochs, leading styles, written genres, presentation of the oeuvre of outstanding authors.
